### Directions to Struble Trail



From PA Rt. 282 turn onto Norwood Rd. in Downingtown. The Struble Trail entrance and parking lot is located off of Norwood Rd. via The Ponds (formerly Kardon Park). Parking and fishing access locations also found off of Rt. 282 on Dowlin Forge Rd. near Shamona Township Park and Dowlin Forge Park.

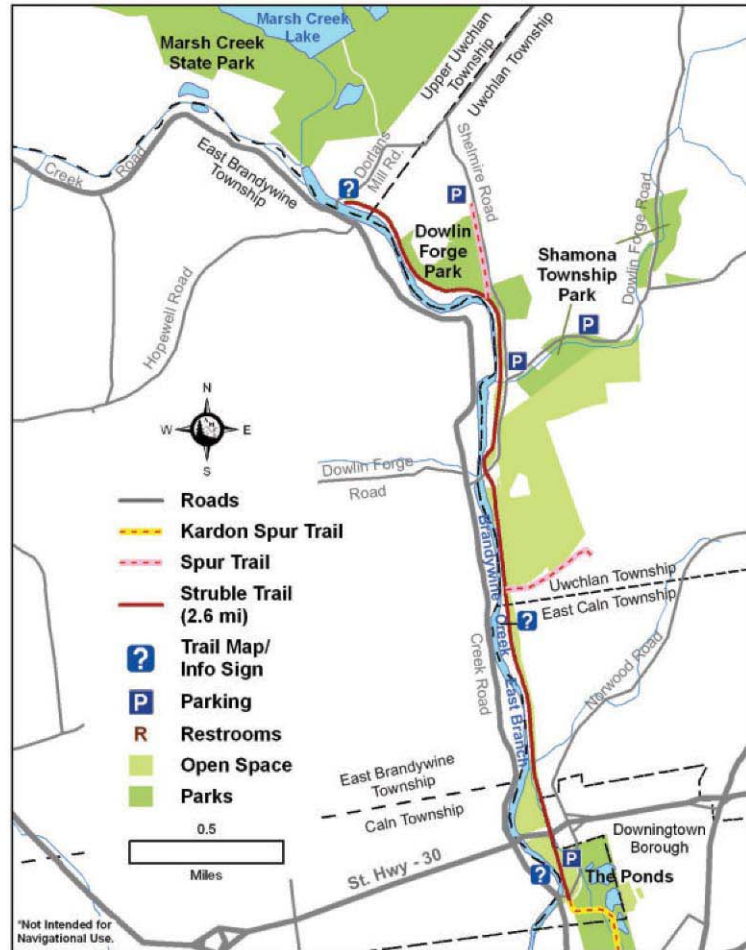

## Struble Trail

**Struble Trail** is a 2.6-mile paved, multi-use recreational trail along the beautiful Brandywine Creek near Downingtown in Chester County. It is popular with hikers, walkers, bicyclists, anglers, picnickers, and nature enthusiasts. The trail is a multi-municipal "work in progress." When completed, the 16-mile trail will go from Marsh Creek State Park through Lyndell, Cornog, and Glenmoore, passing Springton Manor Farm, Struble Lake, and end near Honey Brook Borough. The trail was named in honor of the late County Commissioner and longtime executive director of the Brandywine Valley Association, Robert G. Struble.
