Directions to Hibernia County Park



From Rt. 30 proceed to Rt. 82 north. Go 2.1 miles to Cedar Knoll Rd. Turn left and go 1.2 miles to the park entrance on the left.

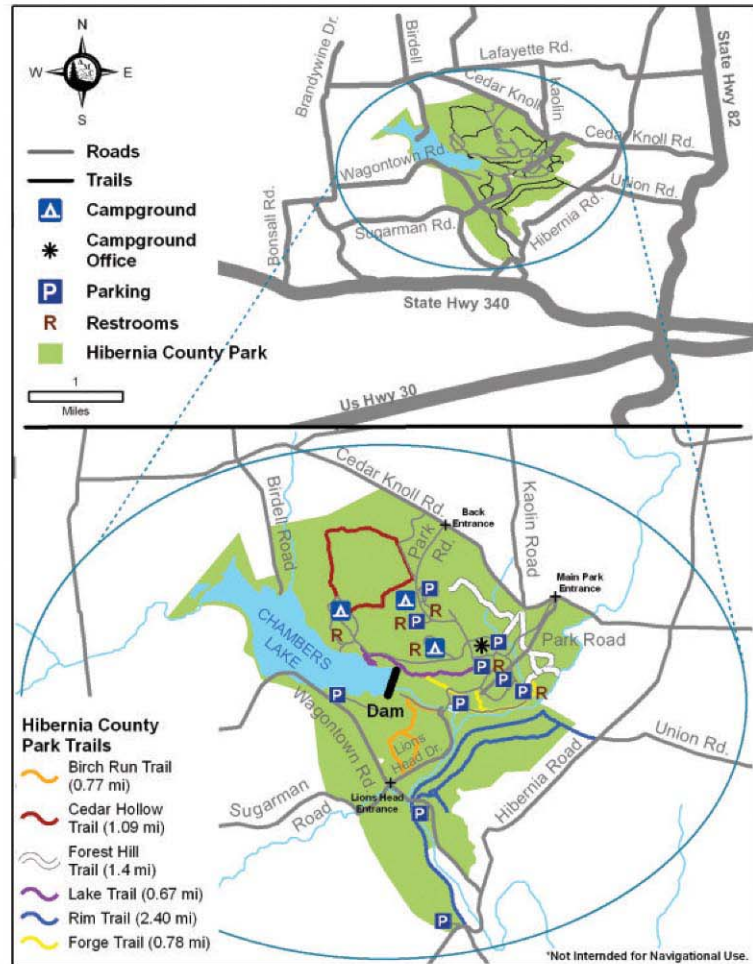

Hibernia County Park

Hibernia County Park, once the site of a bustling iron industry, has trails, woodlands, meadows, open fields, play areas, pavilions, camping, and picnic areas throughout its 990 acres. There are more than 5 miles of multi-use trails including the Forge Trail with a surface still black with charcoal dust from the Iron Forge era. Fishing is popular on the West Branch of the Brandywine Creek and the 90-acre Chambers Lake. The 19th century restored Hibernia Mansion was the original home of the Ironmasters that operated the Hibernia Iron Works.
