Directions to Money Rocks County Park



From the Pennsylvania Turnpike (Rt. 76), take exit 298. Go south on Rt. 10, 0.9 miles to Rt. 23. Go west on Rt. 23 7.8 miles to Rt. 897. Go south on Rt. 897, 0.6 miles to Rt. 322. Go east on Rt. 322, 2.9 miles to Narvon Rd. Go right on Narvon Rd. 1.2 miles to the Money Rocks Park entrance on the right.

WELSH MOUNTAIN CONSERVATION AREA Money Rocks County Park

Money Rocks County Park is named after its rocky spine of boulders where, during the Civil War, farmers of the Pequea Valley allegedly hid their cash from approaching Confederate soldiers. The legend goes that when they returned, the farmers couldn't find their money! The park has 3.5 miles of scenic and natural surfaced trails. Hikers can experience the serene woodlands and impressive rock outcroppings of Welsh Mountain, plus beautiful views of farmland and distant wooded hills. The park preserves a nice portion of Welsh Mountain, the second largest contiguous forest left in Lancaster County.

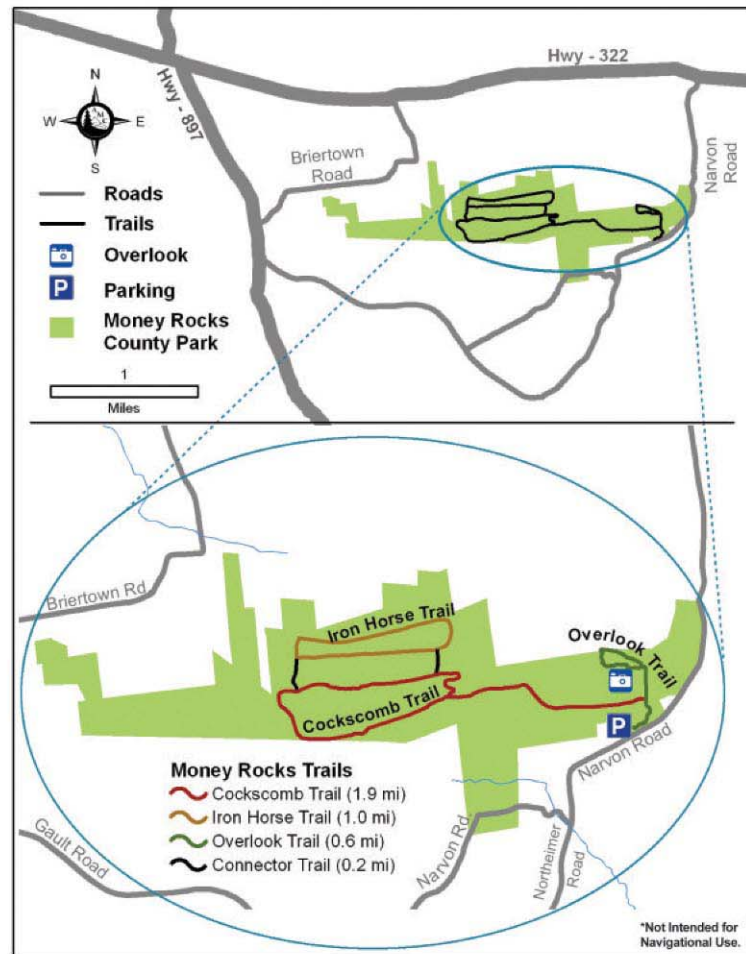

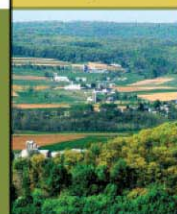
